Using the lowveld and middleveld range types, explain the differences between sweet veld and mixed (sweet-sour) veld of Swaziland. (25 points)

One of the important aspects of range management is to determine the condition of rangelands for livestock use in order to prevent undue damage to vegetation. Discuss the methods used to determine grass cover, composition and production in rangeland condition assessment. (25 points)

QUESTION 5

The savannas of Swaziland support large, diverse and dynamic ecosystems sustaining both wildlife and agricultural enterprises. In several cases, however, alien shrubs have been noted to invade the grasslands of this ecosystem. Such invasion has been known as a recent ecological phenomena characterized by a plant density of the invasive shrubs that reaches beyond the level the ecosystem can carry under 'a climax equilibrial' condition. Particularly, considerable extension of *Chromolaena odorata* has been reported in the region. Discuss the use of the following methods for controlling the invasion of *Chromolaena odorata*.

- A) The manual methods (8 points)
- B) The chemical method (7 points)
- C) Biological method (10 points)
