### Question 1

- a) Using examples to support your answer, explain why a materials Developer needs to understand the communication process before embarking on developing any instructional materials for a specified target audience. (10 marks)
- b) "Four key components form the framework of the instructional development procedure, namely; nature of the target audience, communication goal/instructional objectives, choice of instructional strategies/methods and learning activities, and evaluation procedures". Using concrete examples to support your answer, explain how each one of these components influences the process of developing instructional materials. (16 marks)
- c) "One of the main components of a media development model is problem analysis". Using examples to support your answer, explain what problem analysis involve when developing instructional materials. (6 marks)
- d) Explain briefly how the three patterns of teaching and learning namely; mass instruction, small group instruction and individualized instruction influence you as develop instructional materials. (8 marks)

### Question 2

- a) Why is it necessary to conduct job, task and content analysis before you can develop materials for teaching/learning content? (6 marks)
- b) Group learning methods such as case study, simulation, and critical incident technique can be used to present materials for teaching / learning content.
