**QUESTION 1**

"Literature,... reflects the life of a people..... It reflects in word images a people's consciousness of the tensions and conflicts arising out of their struggles to mould a meaningful social environment founded on their combined actions... Literature thus contains people's images of themselves in history and of their place in the universe."(Ngugi waThiong'o, 1986).

The above-quoted excerpt indicates the connections in the linguistic, socio-cultural and aesthetic contexts of literature. Discuss these connections in order to explain the relevance of Literature in English as a subject to secondary school education in ESL situations.

There is a move in your school to remove Shakespeare's plays from the Literature in English syllabus. As Head of Department, write a position paper to explain why Shakespeare's plays must not be removed from the Literature in English syllabus at secondary school level in Swaziland.

Discuss the relevance of poetry to the enjoyment and study of Literature at secondary school level in ESL situations.
