- b) Choose one of the phrase-structure trees in Question 1(a). Give one example of each of the terms in (a) from this tree. [10 marks]

- a) What is the purpose of the substitution test and the stand-alone test? [5 marks]
- b) For each of the phrase-structure trees in Question (1a), apply the substitution test and the stand-alone test to the direct object NP and give the results. [20 marks]

### **QUESTION 4**

Consider the following expression and then answer all the questions that follow.

**Can you kindly show me your watch again.**

- a) What is the locution of the statement? (2 marks)
- b) What is its illocution? (2 marks)
- c) What is its possible perlocution? (2 marks)
- b) Give one of its presuppositions. (2 marks)
- e) Using the presupposition you gave in (d) above, give an answer that would;
- i) deny the presupposition (2 marks)
  - ii) acknowledge the presupposition (2 marks)
  - iii) restate the presupposition (2 marks)

- iv) accept the presupposition and then supply an appropriate response (2 marks)
- f) Give three conditions that would make the above statement felicitous. (3 marks)

Suppose the hearer gives the following response:

**You mean my watch, I bought it at the OK.**

- g) What Gricean principle would he/she be violating?. Explain why you say this. (4 marks)
- h) What would be one reason for the hearer to violate this principle? (2 marks)

### QUESTION 5

- a) The meaning of meaning has been associated with a number of semantic concepts. Discuss fully **any two** of the following semantic concepts in relation to how far each one of them goes in defining meaning and also show the shortcomings of each one of them.
- i) referential theory of meaning
  - ii) mentalist theory of meaning
  - iii) semantic feature theory of meaning

- b) Define the term ambiguity. (1)
- c) With the aid of examples explain the difference between structural ambiguity and lexical ambiguity. (4)
- d) Disambiguate each of the following sentences by writing sentences that convey those different meanings associated with the ambiguous sentences:
- i) The Rabbi married my sister.
  - ii) They are moving sidewalks.
  - iii) Visiting strangers can be dangerous at night.
  - iv) They shot the thief with a gun.
  - v) She can't bear children.
