  - iii) a sentence with a ditransitive monomorphemic verb subcategorizing for a goal and a theme. (2 marks)
  - iv) a sentence with a non—monomorphemic verb whose basic verb is intransitive sentence whose subject NP is an experiencer.
  - v) a sentence whose subject NP is a locative.

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
