ii) For each of the trees in Question 1(ii), passivize the direct object and give the result. [10 marks]

iii) For each of the results in (ii), explain how passivization removes the ambiguity. [8 marks]

i) Choose one of the phrase-structure trees in Question 1(ii). For this tree, identify two (2) nodes that are sisters. Justify your answer. [7 marks]

ii) For each of the trees in Question 1(ii), cleft the direct object and give the result.

iii) For each of the results in (ii), explain how clefting removes the ambiguity.
