QUESTION ONE

Analyse the following extract quoted from the praises of King Dlamini 111 according to the Imbongi Maboya Fukudze, clearly articulating the referents of the praise where this King is portrayed as an illustrious hero, and also pointing out instances of allusion to historical incidents:

Mlawulela sizwe sakho ngendlela Ngekuncabela izizwe zikuhlasela Kulase Mzimbayaneni

Longaweli etubukweni lelishonako Uwela ngelenhlabatsi Umthelethile Ngwane Wamnika Ngwane indvuku Wachubeka nesiswe semaLangeni. (20 Marks)

Discuss <u>two</u> (2) examples of <u>tinanatelo</u> where the societal value of "heroism" is praised, clearly articulating that, what is at the centre of your quoted lines is, indeed, <u>admirable</u>. (20 marks)

Lullabies are meant for children's development and acquisition of the traditional Swazi oral art. Discuss. (20 marks)

QUESTION SIX

"The poem or song is the lifeline of the Swazi; and he learns the art of poetry because he is born and bred in a society which recognizes that the poetic form is, emotionally, most expressive of the human predicament". With relevant examples, discuss the above assertion in relation to Swazi oral poetry. (20 marks)
