QUESTION 1

In some of his stories, Ngugi capitalizes on identity crises where one character falsely discovers him/herself; where one character wants to be another character who is unfortunately another lost soul. Discuss this motif of false self-discovery and comment on the broader postcolonial cultural issues that it touches upon. Illustrate with **one short story** of your choice.

QUESTION 2

Why is first person peripheral point of view the best for telling a mysterious story? Support your answer with illustrations from Nadine Gordimer's 'Look-alikes.'

QUESTION 3

Are lovable characters necessarily socially upright beings that could be good examples to be emulated by members of a society? Why do we love even morally decadent characters in literature? Your answer should be supported by evidence from a novel of your choice.

QUESTION 4

"The fact that Jagwa, the main character in Ekwensi's Jagwa Nana is named after a commercial/material product is very telling of the themes and plot progression of this novel." Discuss this view with evidence from the novel.

QUESTION 5

How much credence do you accord the view that *Equiano's Travels* is not a genuine autobiography? Discuss with evidence from the text.

QUESTION 6

"It is efforts or contributions of his associates more than Equiano's ingenuity and strength of personality that propel Equiano to his destiny." Debate this view with evidence from the text.
