Name Dionysius Thrax's parts of speech. Define each of these parts of speech. State how Priscian's parts of speech differ from those of Dionysius Thrax. What is the reason for this difference? [25 marks]

Name four (4) scholars that contributed to the study of Phonetics and Phonology in the history of Western Linguistics from time periods later than Medieval Europe. Describe the contributions of each of these scholars. [25 marks]

Question 8

What is Grimm's Law? State nine (9) changes that took place between Proto-Indo-European and Proto-Germanic, according to Grimm's Law. State three (3) generalizations about these nine (9) changes. Why has Grimm's Law been so influential in the history of Western Linguistics?
