QUESTION 3

- (a) Each of the following sentences has a clause that appears in italics. Indicate whether it is a main clause or subordinate clause.

 - (ii) Western medicine differs greatly from Chinese medicine, which is rooted in Eastern culture and philosophy. [2 marks]
