(v) Which Gricean maxim has been flouted due to the child's inability to recognize the pragmatic force the parent's utterance? Explain how that

maxim has been flouted.

What is likely to be the situational context of the above discourse? [3 marks]

QUESTION 4

Read the extract below and answer the questions that will follow.

Craig was horrified when his children who are in Grade 6 and 7 came home one day and complained about the behaviour of some teachers at Wilgehof Primary School in Bloemfontein. They told him the Social Science teacher, Leonard McKay, displayed a large apartheid era flag at the front of the class and often referred to black people as k****rs in front of the black children in class. According to his children, the teacher had a poster in the classroom showing apes hanging on a rope under which was an image of former ANCYL president, Julius Malema. The caption read, "Amazing natural phenomenon! Studies were conducted to determine why these primates made these expressions and findings showed they were as a result of their primitive brains wanting to speak but they could only make confusing noises." Craig was outraged and complained to the principal about what was happening but he says no action was taken. ... "I won't allow a few people to poison the minds of

my children", says Craig. "It's despicable that racism is present in this day and age – and shockingly at a primary school. We should stand up and condemn such racism directed to our children!"
