Craig was outraged and complained to the principal about what was happening but he says no action was taken. "I won't allow a few people to poison the minds of my childern," says Craig. " It's despicable that racism is present in this day and age – and shockingly at a primary school. We should stand up and condemn such racism directed at our children!"
