Read the two paragraphs given below and answer the questions that follow.

Much of the indigenous African Folklore, especially expressive culture, exists largely in an oral form in many African countries. Being part of Africa, Swaziland is no exception to this situation. Most of the said folklore exists in oral forms and remains exclusively known in its undiluted forms to a few old Swazis sparsely found in different rural regions of Swaziland and South Africa. The word folklore as used in this context covers such cultural elements as traditional folk narratives, riddles, proverbs and idioms, folk poetry, folk games, folk music, religious folk beliefs, folk medicine, folk dress, folk tools, folk food and beverages as well as folk utensils of the Swazis. Despite sporadic publications on this important Swazi cultural heritage by the early missionaries and colonial civil servants and by the early Swazi Christians writers as well as by modern Swazi, what is currently documented on this aspect of the Swazi heritage still remains a mere drop in the ocean compared to what remains orally known but undocumented.

As this folklore remains largely an oral tradition, each time an old Swazi passes on somewhere in the village, a sizable portion of this cultural heritage goes with him/her to the grave. It is crucially important to do something about it now while there is still something to be salvaged. This study is intended to have this important heritage well documented and preserved in selected resource centres where it can be accessible to researchers, the public in general and the world at large for various purposes.
