Question 1

Write a brief critical synthesis of Kempkey's (2008) argument that religion has historically been linked to the formation of the modern African state and society rather than being a recent development occasioned by religious radicalization.

Question 2

Explain why defining religion from the combined substantive and functionalist approach is particularly apt for examining the interplay between religion and ideology in post-colonial Africa.

Question 3

Using Antonio Gramsci's theory of hegemony, analyse the appropriation of religion for political ends by General IK Acheampong's military administration in Ghana from 1972 to 1978.

Question 4

Explain the role of regional politics in fomenting inter and intra-religious conflict in Nigeria.

Question 5

Write a response to the observations made by Vanderpoel (2012) in her analysis of the Kenyan High Court ruling of 2010 that declared Kadhis' Courts as unconstitutional and a violation of state secularism.

Question 6

Explain the ironic fact that religion has not become a force for political mobilisation in Tanzania despite evidence that since the beginning of the 1990s religion emerged as a foremost category of social identity.
