- a) Outline four properties of a good tax system. In your opinion is the tax system in Swaziland a good tax system? Explain.
- b) Employing a partial equilibrium analysis, analyse the incidence of an ad valorem tax. Use a graph to indicate clearly how the tax burden is shared between the consumer and producer.

Question 2

Write short expounding notes on each of the following:

- a) Tax evasion and tax avoidance. Use one example for each.
- b) Tax neutrality and optimal taxation
- c) Ricardian equivalence and inter-temporal debt burden
- d) Laffer curve. Use the graph.
- e) Formal and effective incidence of a tax

(5 marks each)

Question 3

- a) Discuss, using a graph, the effect of demand elasticity on excess burden and tax reveriue. Use elastic and inelastic demand curves and assume that a selective tax is levied on good X. Be sure to define the term excess burden and show it in your graph. (20marks)
- b) Why is it important for the tax system in Swaziland to be administrative efficient? Explain. (5 marks)

Question 4

- a) Define public debt. Outline the size and composition of public debt in Swaziland as of January 2017. **(15 marks)**
- b) In your opinion, is the public debt in Swaziland sustainable? Support your answer using the various applicable critical ratios for Swaziland. Use data that is as current as possible. (10 marks)

Question 5

- a) Outline the main important parts of the Swaziland national budget speech 2017/18. What is the theme of this budget? State any five challenges facing the economy as indicated in this speech. Use data as much as possible. (15 marks)
- b) State the total budget allocations (in Emalangeni) for education, health, agriculture and defence. In your opinion are these allocations adequate in ensuring that Vision 2022 is realised? Explain. (10 marks)
