a) One of the properties of a good tax is administrative efficiency. Explain. Does the tax regime in Swaziland conform to this property? Explain. (6 marks)

b) Sketch the Laffer curve and explain the relationship it depicts. (5 marks)

c) List the sources of government revenue in Swaziland. Indicate the current percentage contributions of each to total revenue. Comment on the proposal to tax electricity consumption under VAT in Swaziland. (9 marks)
