#### Question 2

Mr. X asks what is happening and before a response is given, assaults Mrs. X with an open hand on the face. Mrs. X falls down and cries. In the meantime, Mr. X goes for Mr. Y with the intention of assaulting him. Whilst Mr. X is grabbing Mr. Y by his clothes, Mrs. X picks up a vase and hits Mr. X with it on the head and as a result, Mr. X gets badly injured and falls down and becomes unconscious. This happens in the full view of Mr. and Mrs. X's 10-year old son who makes a sound recording of the commotion as it unfolds using a cellphone. Police arrive and Mrs. X is arrested and charged with Attempted Murder. A few months later Mrs. X is put on trial. Mr. X, the 10-year old son and Mr. Y are called as witnesses.

(a) Is Mr. X a compellable witness? (3 marks)

(b) Is the 10-year old son a competent witness? (9 marks)

(c) If Mr. Y refuses to testify how may he be dealt with? (7 marks)

(d) Is the sound recording admissible? (6 marks)
