#### **OUESTION 4**

"[T]he... Court ...[is] the <u>custos morum</u> of the people and --- there's in that court residual power, where no statute has yet intervened to supercede the common law, to superintend those offences which are prejudicial to public welfare. Such occasions will be rare, for parliament has not been slow to legislate when attention has been sufficiently aroused. But gaps remain, and will always remain, since no one can forsee every way in which the wickedness of man may disrupt the order of society".

To what extent, in your view, is this reasoning persuasive in the socio-economic and legal environment of Swaziland? [25 MARKS]
