Magdelene Dlamini is a woman who is HIV positive and has had her status disclosed in a magazine for the youth. She is desirous of instituting legal action as she feels that it was in appropriate for the publishers of the Youth magazine to disclose her name without her consent.

She has approached you for legal advice. You are required to identify all the legal issues herein. State in particular whether, there has been a violation of her rights and what they are.

Soon after the deportation, Gule addressed a meeting of the Federation of Swaziland Employers at which he called Dlamini "not a fanatic" but a criminal in the fullest sense of the word." He stated that the government had acted correctly and urged that he should not be allowed to return. Dlamini was later permitted to return.
