Section 106 of the 2005 Constitution of Swaziland provides:

Subject to the provisions of this Constitution -

- (a) the supreme legislative authority of Swaziland vests in the King-in-Parliament;
- (b) the King and Parliament may make laws for the peace, order and good governance of Swaziland.

Interrogate the provision with a view to responding to the question whether it permits of legislation by way of Decree, or any of the forms legislation took after the repeal of the 1968 Constitution and dissolution of Parliament.
