In Matsamo there is a lake called Lake Matsamo. This famous lake is a source where a number of fisherman derive an income from the available species of fish, particularly the famous 'Matsamo fish.' However, there is a specific type of fish that these fisherman are prohibited from fishing being the crayfish. This prohibition is in terms of the Fisheries Ordinance 30 of 1920. Chakijane Chakide, a highly skilled fisherman who is also a celebrity in the Matsamo area has been caught having unlawfully fished the prohibited species of fish. The boat that he used when committing the illegal act was also confiscated when he was arrested. This boat, however, does not belong to Chakide but belongs to a third party who was not a party to the crime. The prosecutor in the case has applied for the forfeiture of the boat. Chakide's legal counsel has argued that the section that relates to forfeiture of the boat was never intended by the legislature to apply to punish individuals not otherwise involved in the illegal act.
