### **<u>OUESTION 1</u>** (Compulsory)

The deceased Senzo Gwebu was a Swazi man married to Zipho in terms of Civil rites, and in community of property. Two children were born of this union, Sipho who is 26 years old, and Gcinile who is 16 years old. During the subsistence of this marriage, Mr. Gwebu contracted a second marriage, through customary rites with one Fikile Sukati. Lihle, who is 10 years old, is their only daughter.

Sipho has come to you for legal advice on issues pertaining to this late father's estate. According to Sipho, his father left a Will which was signed by Fikile. Apparently, she did this on Mr. Gwebu's instruction, and by his direction. According to Sipho, his father was quite unwell during the period when the will was executed.

Sipho informs you that Fikile, her daughter, her father and brother, have been appointed as the sole beneficiaries, as per the provisions of the Will in question. The late Mr. Gwebu's estate is estimated to be about E6 million in value. According to Sipho, the will does not contain a certificate by a Commissioner of Oaths. Sipho wishes to challenge the will, and decries the fact that his mother, Gcinile and he have been completely left out of the will.

Advise Sipho on his chances of successfully challenging the validity of the estate, and also inform him how best the estate would be administered in the event that the will is held to be invalid.

#### **QUESTION 2**

Critically discuss the purpose and provisions of the Intestate Succession Act, 1953, viewed in juxtaposition with Section 34 (1) of the Constitution of Swaziland, 2005.
