- 1. How did the conservative reaction to the Enlightenment contribute to the rise of sociology as an academic discipline in the nineteenth century?
- 2. Distinguish between materialism and idealism, and critically discuss Karl Marx's use of the term dialectic in his analysis of the historical development of society.
- 3. Define the term *verstehen* and critically discuss the steps involved in conducting a sociological analysis of social action according to Max Weber.
- 4. In his book, *The Rules of Sociological Method*, Emile Durkheim asserts that the first and most basic rule is to consider social facts as things. Discuss this statement using examples.

- 5. Using examples, discuss the relationship between the cultural system and the social system in Talcott Parsons's general action system.
- 6. Critically discuss the sociological significance of conflict with specific reference to Lewis Coser's analysis of the functions of social conflict.
- 7. Define Harold Garfinkel's concept of accounts, and explain why ethnomethodologists are interested in analysing people's accounts and the ways these accounts are presented to others.
- 8. Discuss Jean Baudrillard's view that simulation has replaced production and that contemporary culture has gone beyond the classical Marxist *use value/exchange value* distinction.
